(D) Cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving ventilation.

District will continue the daily cleaning of our buildings. Will uses disinfectant spray machines in this cleaning process.

(E) Contact tracing in combination with isolation and quarantine, in collaboration with the State, local, territorial, or Tribal health departments.

Our school nurse will work with our county health departments in the contact tracing, isolation, and quarantine of positive COVID-19 cases.

(F) Diagnostic and screening testing.

Our school nurse will work with our county health departments in the diagnostic and screen testing of positive COVID-19 cases.

(G) Efforts to provide vaccinations to school communities.

School district will work with local health departments to support the vaccination process with school communities.

(H) Appropriate accommodations for children with disabilities with respect to health and safety policies.

The school district will follow all accommodations mandated through the federal I.D.E.A law to ensure the needs of our students with disabilities are met.
